I could not believe the words I was hearing. Life changed for all the Delaware Daughters at that moment. The State Society was in shock. Each Chapter and the Board expressed their grief and support of Susan's Family by sending donations to The National Society. Some donations were allocated specifically to Friends of Veterans and Friends of Junior Membership, as Susan was passionate about these committees. On June 15th many Delaware Daughters again showed their respect for Susan and support for her family by attending her Memorial service. The love and respect that was felt for Susan was clear in the testimonies given by those in attendance.

I know I have a high bar to meet following Susan's successful term, but I can assure you I will do my best to meet all the demands and challenges ahead. I want to share with you how honored I am to serve with you in this great society.

The 128th Congress was an amazing experience. My week started on Monday with an eight-hour orientation for New State Regents that gave us an overwhelming amount of helpful information. My Mentors and DAR friends, Historian General, Ginger Trader and Vice President General, Claudia Onken helped make this a very positive experience. Tribute to Susan Meade-Beachell

Delaware State Regent 2016-2019

This edition of The Starfish is dedicated to Susan Meade-Beachell who passed away suddenly on Memorial Day, May 27, 2019. She will be remembered for all her contributions to her Chapter and the Delaware State Society of the NSDAR.

Susan Mead-Beachell joined the DAR on October 14, 1993 at the age of 38 through her paternal line. Her patriot was Jonathan Cutler from Massachusetts, who served as a Private during the American Revolution. Two years after joining the DAR, Susan began serving in leadership positions in her home chapter of Cooch's Bridge. She served two terms as a Chapter Treasurer, one term as Chapter Vice Regent and one term as Chapter Regent 2001-2004.

Susan also served in the Delaware State Society as State Corresponding Secretary, State Registrar, State Vice Regent and State Regent 2016-2019. She was the State Chair for multiple State Committees including The DAR Magazine Committee, The DAR Museum Outreach Committee, and The Women's Issues Committee. One of Susan's greatest joys in DAR was conducting the installation of her daughter, Elizabeth Ann Beachell.

Susan's State Regent projects included the commission of an oil painting of Elizabeth "Betty" Seimes, the only President General from Delaware. This painting now hangs outside the Delaware Room in the DAR Museum. Funding from her State Regent's project was, also, dedicated to the Home of the Brave in Milford, DE to support homeless female veterans and their children. Susan conducted her last State meeting on April 13, 2019. President General Dillon was present as Susan proudly unveiled the portrait of Honorary President General Elizabeth Seimes. At that meeting, Susan was unanimously elected to serve as an Honorary State Regent for the State of Delaware. The Delaware Daughters are deeply saddened by the loss of someone who gave so much to our Society and still had so much to give. Honorary State Regent, Susan Meade-Beachell you will be greatly missed.

In just the U.S. alone, it is estimated that 500 million straws are used every day. One study found that as many as 8.3 billion plastic straws pollute the world's beaches. Skipping the straw is an easy way to make an impact!


